

Transfer from Mt.SAC to USC for Engineering or Computer Science

Keep in Mind:

If you meet the minimum requirements, you can apply to transfer after one year!

Completing <u>all</u> GE Classes is not required or recommended.

There is <u>no minimum GPA</u> to apply.

Engineering classes are not required or recommended.

Recommended Preparation at Mt.SAC Includes:

Courses listed below can be in progress at the point of application submission.

- 1. Two math courses (either calculus or higher-level math beyond calculus) after high school with a *minimum* of your Calculus II equivalent listed below:
 - a. Mt.SAC equivalent to Calculus II: MATH 181
- 2. Two Chemistry or Calc-Based Physics Courses*
 - a. For Chemistry, start with CHEM 50**
 - b. For Physics, start with PHYS 4A with PHYS 4B
 - c. Computer Science Applicants may take C++ Programming classes in lieu of science courses if they prefer***
- 3. USC Writing Requirement: ENGL 1C**
- 4. Be enrolled in 4 classes/semester or 3 classes/quarter (strongly recommended). This is best represented as a calculus class, a science or programming class, a writing class, and a General Education equivalent.
- 5. Continued Academic Rigor and progress toward the intended degree are expected if a student has completed the minimum requirements
 - *Effective fall 2022, lab science courses should be taken in the traditional classroom format, not online/hybrid.
 - ** Substitute Course(s) may exist at your institution. Please refer to the articulation agreement for details.
 - *** Computer science students may take programming courses instead of, or in addition to, lab-based science courses. While programming courses very rarely transfer for course-equivalent credit at USC, they can be good preparation for placement exams. If a student does well enough on a placement exam for a particular course at USC, the student may be able to waive that course requirement. More info at viterbi.link/programming.

Please consult our transfer webpage for specific course plans by major.
